LRECON = position of the party in 1999 in terms of its ideological stance <u>on economic issues</u> (role of government in economy), where 0 indicates that a party is at the extreme left of the ideological spectrum, 10 indicates that it is at the extreme right, and 5 means that it is at the center (Q8b). [1999 only]

GALTAN = position of the party in 1999 in terms of its ideological stance <u>on democratic freedoms and rights</u> (role of government in life choices), where 0 indicates that a party is at the extreme left of the ideological spectrum, 10 indicates that it is at the extreme right, and 5 means that it is at the center (Q8c). [1999 only]

LR_GEN = position of the party in YEAR in terms of its broad ideological stance on a scale from 0 to 1. Data for 1984 are from Castles and Mair; for 1996 from Hix and Lord, Huber and Inglehart; for 1999 from this party survey Q8a; 1988 and 1992 are linear interpolations where possible. All values are standardized to values between 0 and 1.
